












Pick Up Your Name and Write: The Life Of Wilma Elizabeth McDaniel






I Can't Believe It's Not Cake! Picture Frames


The Invisble Life of Addie LaRue by Victoria Schwab

The Invisible Life of Addie LaRue by V.E. Schwab is a fantasy novel about a young woman who makes a deal with the Dark to live forever, but is cursed to be forgotten by everyone she meets. The story follows Addie LaRue as she navigates her life across centuries and continents, learning to leave her mark on the world



All the Light We Cannot See by Anthony Doerr

All the Light We Cannot See by Anthony Doerr follows two characters during World War II: Marie-Laure, a blind French girl, and Werner, a German soldier. Marie-Laure flees Paris with her father to Saint-Malo, where they hide from the Nazis. Werner, a German orphan, is recruited into the army and ends up in Saint-Malo as well. Their lives intersect as the war unfolds, exploring themes of survival, humanity, and the impact of war on ordinary people. The novel highlights small moments of resistance and connection in dark times.



The Girl on the Train by Paula Hawkins

The Girl on the Train is a psychological thriller centered on Rachel, an alcoholic woman who, during her daily train commute, observes a couple, Megan and Scott. After Megan goes missing, Rachel becomes entangled in the investigation. As she tries to piece together the truth, her unreliable memory and troubled past blur the lines between reality and illusion, revealing secrets, lies, and the devastating consequences of deception.



Anita de Monte Laughs Last: A Novel by Zochitl Gonzalez

Anita de Monte Laughs Last by Zochitl Núñez follows Anita, a Mexican-American girl who uses humor to navigate personal challenges and societal pressures. The novel explores themes of identity, resilience, and empowerment as Anita learns to embrace her true self and cultural heritage.










Creative Writing Workshop
